



NESC will honor Debby and Jim Lash on November 15th 2018, at the Greenwich Country Club by the National Executive Service Corps (NESC), as a recognition of their outstanding leadership. Richard and Anne Adler will present, and the Yale Alley Cats will provide entertainment.

Debby has been Board Chairman of the United Way of Greenwich, President of the Junior League of Greenwich and Chairman of the Hood College Board of Trustees. She is a Member of the Friends of Nathaniel Witherell, a Member of the Friends of Acadia National Park and Founder and Chair of the Governance Committee for the Child Guidance Center. Debby was presented with the YWCA's Spirit of Greenwich Award, the President's Award from the Friends of Acadia National Park, the Leadership Award from the United Way of Greenwich and the Phyllis Finn Mentor Award from the Junior League of Greenwich. She received her B.A. in Education from Hood College, an M.Ed. from Towson University and her J.D. from the University of Detroit.

Jim currently is a Venture Capitalist, serving as Chairman of Manchester Principal LLC. Previously he was the CEO of Reading Tube Corporation, Director of Operations at Touche Ross and Co. and headed the Boeing team for NASA's Apollo Space Program. He is a Director and Chair of the Audit Committee for Baker Hughes and has been on the Boards of Ivy Animal Health, Webridge, Inc., B.H.I.T., Inc. and Vesper Corporation. Jim was First Selectman for Greenwich and has also served as Chairman of the Budget Committee of the Board of Estimate and Taxation. His nonprofit associations include the American Cancer Society, President of Greenwich Library, Board Member for NYC Center and East West Institute and a Trustee for MIT. Jim holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering from MIT and a Master's in Business Administration from Tulane University.

The Alley Cats are an a cappella group from Yale founded in 1943. This past year, they toured China, Hawaii, Australia and New Zealand. Though originally rooted in American jazz music, their repertoire now includes pop hits, Motown and other genres. They have sung for former Presidents Obama and Clinton, Her Majesty Queen Silvia of Sweden, and at the final concert of the Dresden Music Festival.
